This is what the cards look like.



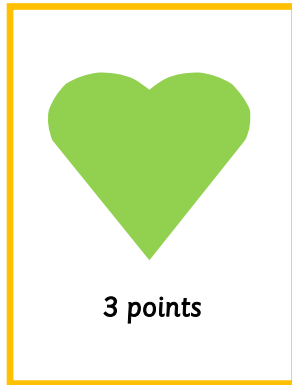
During the first round, Josh finds 2  cards and 3  cards. How many points does he have?
