Jack and the Beanstalk

Jack is a young boy living with his widowed mother. When their cow stopped giving milk, Jack's mother makes him take her to market for sale. On the way, he meets an old man, who

offers magic beans in exchange for the cow and Jack makes the trade. When he arrives home without any money, his mom is furious, throws the beans to the ground, and sends Jack to bed.
