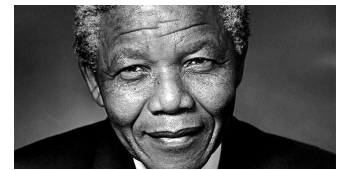

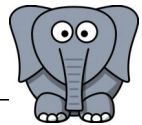

Our Flag



The South African Flag was designed by Mr Fred Bronwell. It was first used on 27 April 1994. The flag of South Africa was designed to symbolize unity. The red, white and blue colours were taken from the colours of the Boer Republics. The yellow, black and green are taken from the African National Congress (ANC) flag. Black symbolises the people, green the fertility of the land, and gold the mineral wealth beneath the soil. Those colours were adopted by the ANC in 1925. The South African flag is the only national flag to display six colours as part of its primary design.
